Federal funds are available to help you safely reopen, sustain the safe operation of your school, and address the impact of the coronavirus pandemic on your students. The **Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER)** provides <u>federal funding to states</u> to distribute to local educational agencies (LEAs) through 2024. ESSER Fund awards are distributed in the same proportion for each state as Part A of Title I.

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Allowable ESSER funds include any activities covered under the Perkins Act, including professional development, program development, career counseling, or learning platforms for CTE, including the use of technology within CTE programs and programs of study. Address unfinished learning by preparing your students for industry-recognized certifications and providing real-world learning opportunities that will positively impact their futures.
