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What can Perkins funding be used for?

CTE teachers can request local applications for Perkins grants to purchase materials that support CTE programs, whether it is for <u>professional development</u>, program development, career counseling, or learning platforms. Perkins V specifically notes that funds can be used for increasing the effective use of technology within career and technical education programs and programs of study. Each state has a list of allowed expenses, and while print textbooks, workbooks, and lab manuals may not be eligible, **instructor resources, online curriculum, activities, and additional supports found in G-W Online Solutions are purchased by districts all over the country using Perkins funding**. Perkins funding is made available each year.

How do I apply?

Every state has a different application portal on their website. To find your state's application, navigate to your state's DOE website, select the CTE section, and look for Perkins information. Contacting a member of your state's CTE staff directory is also a great way to quickly find the information you need.

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What information do I need to complete an application?

Comprehensive Needs Assessment (updated once every 2 years) including:

Program CTE Performance Indicators, which include your district's graduation rates, academic proficiencies in core subjects, rates of placement in postsecondary programs and careers after graduation, and non-traditional program enrollment. The Comprehensive Needs Assessment also requires information on CTE program quality indicators. Each state selects which indicators are needed. Check the Perkins information for your state to know which indicator(s) will be used. These may include the number of students who:

- · attained industry-recognized credentials/certifications,
- attained postsecondary (dual) credits,
- participate in work-based learning or,
- the percentage of CTE concentrators (students completing two or more CTE courses) achieving measures of success.

NOTE: CTE Performance Indicators are usually tracked by your district. Ask your CTE Director or Principal for this information if you don't have it already.

- How the program size, scope, and quality meets student population needs
- How the program is aligned to the needs of local in-demand industry sectors or occupations
- Program plan and progress of equal access for all students
