## **NEW TO THIS EDITION**


The third edition of *Lifespan Development* has been revised with an updated art program to reflect the diversity seen in classrooms and students' lives. Language around disabilities and developmental delays, as well as pregnancy and birth, was updated to be more inclusive in this edition.

This edition also saw changes to the end-of-chapter content and the Checkpoints within the chapter. A new HOSA Event Prep activity was added to each chapter to help students prepare for the Human Development event. Lastly, the learning objectives are now clearly aligned with headings in the text chapter, as well as summary points to create a clear connection.

- In Chapter 2, discussions of ecological theory of development and the impact that different socioeconomic environments have on development are expanded upon from the previous edition.
- In Chapter 4 information about how healthy behaviors affect pregnant people, their partners, and their future children are also discussed with greater detail.
- Chapter 5's discussion of infant development is expanded in several ways, including more information on neurons, neural pathways, and brain development.
- Chapter 6 now contains information on exploratory play and additional information on language development in toddlers.
- Chapter 7 provides additional information about how poverty and poor nutrition impacts brain development in young children, as well as more information about windows of opportunity.
- Chapter 9 now includes Vygotsky's sociocultural theory of cognitive development. Brain growth and development in teens is also expanded upon. A new feature on opioid drug use in teens has been added.
- Chapter 14 now contains content about how online stores and delivery services impact consumers.
- Chapter 16 has been updated to include information about online opportunities for teachers in the workplace.
- Chapter 17 has a new section on the job opportunities for and responsibilities of public health officials.


